Thetford Academy's mission is to celebrate the unique worth of all students, to nurture their strengths, and to challenge them to fulfill their potential.

TA AT A GLANCE

- Holds the honor of being Vermont's oldest secondary school, founded in 1819
- As a New England town academy, combines a public school mission with an independent governance structure
- Includes a middle school and high school program, enrolling approximately 315 students annually in grades 7 through 12
- Serves as the designated secondary school for the town of Thetford and as a high school option for sending towns throughout the region
- Offers a challenging college preparatory program with a variety of extended learning opportunities
- Features a 295-acre campus that creates an outdoor learning lab with trails, forest, greenhouse, ropes course, and outdoor classrooms
- Maintains a low student-teacher ratio, with an average class size of 14 students
- Includes a co-curricular program with 10 varsity sports, a VEX robotics team, and numerous student clubs
- Enrolls a small contingent of international students from a range of countries, such as Guatemala, Germany, Italy, China, and South Korea in recent years
- Located in the town of Thetford (population ~2500) within Orange County, federally designated as a rural county
- Situated in the Upper Valley community of Vermont and New Hampshire, which includes Dartmouth College, with a vibrant culture of education, arts, science, and more

SPECIAL COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

- Thetford Academy students have myriad opportunities to engage in extended learning on and off campus.
- Dual Enrollment courses at Dartmouth College (when available) and the Vermont State Colleges are available to qualifying juniors and seniors.
- TA's Challenge Course option allows students to design and pursue their own course of study on a topic of personal interest with a mentor. Maximum 1 credit per year.
- A STEM internship with corporate partners Fujifilm Dimatix and Hypertherm gives students hands-on experience in all aspects of business including engineering, marketing, research, and development.
- Environmental Studies and Outdoor Education is a double-credit, immerseive interdisciplinary course covering a wide range of topics with an emphasis on outdoor, experiential, self-directed, project-based learning and recreation.
- Programs at regional career and technical centers prepare students for careers and future training, and can include work-based learning experience (11th-12th).
- Honors courses are offered at the high school level across the curriculum. Designed to challenge advanced learners, these courses prepare students for college-level work.
- Embedded honors opportunities are also available in heterogeneously grouped classes. Students contract with their teachers to complete a rigorous program of study that supplements the standard college-prep curriculum.

SEMESTER BLOCK

Thetford Academy classes run on a semester block schedule. Full credit classes meet for an 85 minute block daily for one semester. Half credit courses meet for 41 minutes daily for one semester. High school students can take up to four full block classes per semester.
